National Chengchi University Incentive Program for New Faculty Members to Apply to MOST Academic Research Programs

- I. National Chengchi University (hereinafter referred to as "NCCU") has established the Program to encourage new faculty members and researchers to apply to MOST Academic Research Programs.
- II. New faculty members and researchers may submit project conceptualizations to apply for subsidies from the Office of Research and Development (hereinafter referred to as "ORD") between their appointment start dates and the end of the current semester. The Dean of ORD is authorized to review and approve these applications.

III. Subsidy categories:

- (I) The subsidy provided herein shall be subject to a maximum limit of NT\$100,000 over a period of up to 10 months. The period of subsidy begins as soon as the applicant is notified of application approval. Subsidies are available in the following categories: assistant pay, work-study pay, local and international travel expenses, purchases of research equipment, books, supplies, and miscellaneous project related expenses.
- (II) Applicants may invite one senior faculty member or researcher with outstanding academic performance (from NCCU or off-campus) to be the project advisor. Invitees will receive NT\$10,000 for each project accepted.
- IV. Professors and researchers receiving subsidies must submit a summarized report of 3-5 pages in length to the ORD one month following the end of the subsidy period. In addition, an application for MOST Academic Research Programs must be submitted during the most recent application period for MOST Academic Research Programs.
- V. The funding needed under the Program shall be provided by income from tuition fees and the five self-financed sources of the NCCU Academic Fund.
- VI. The Program has been implemented with approval of the Office of Research and Development and the Academic Fund Committee. The same procedure shall apply to any subsequent amendments.
