

National Chengchi University Regulations Encouraging Newly-Employed Faculty Members to Apply for the Ministry of Science and Technology Research Grant

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Article 3 approved on May 21, 2008 at the 23rd Research and Development Meeting.

Article 1: These Regulations have been established by the National Chengchi University (hereinafter referred to as "the University") to encourage newly-employed teaching and research personnel to apply for the Ministry of Science and Technology Research Grant.

Article 2: Newly-employed teaching and research personnel may submit their research project proposals to the Office of Research and Development (hereinafter referred to as the "R&D Office") to apply for subsidies. The application shall be submitted before the end of the semester after all pre-employment procedures for new faculty members have been completed. The Dean of the R&D Office shall be authorized to review and approve the applications.

Article 3: Subsidized Items:

- (1) Pursuant to the Regulations, the maximum amount of the subsidy shall be NT\$100,000 and the maximum period shall be 10 months starting from the day of receiving the notice of approval. Subsidized items include salary for assistants, work-study scholarship, domestic and overseas travel expenses, procurements of research equipment, books, material and other miscellaneous fees/expenses related to the project.
- (2) An applicant may engage a distinguished senior faculty member or research personnel, from within the University or from an external organization, to consult on the project. An allowance of NT\$10,000 shall be provided to the enlisted individual.

Article 4: The teaching or research personnel receiving such subsidy shall submit a

concise report of three to five pages to the R&D Office within one month of the expiration of the subsidy period. He/she shall, in the meantime, submit to the Ministry of Science and Technology the application for the Research Grant during the most recent period when the National Science Council accepts such applications.

Article5:The subsidy prescribed in the Regulations shall be financed by the tuition/miscellaneous fees income of the University and the five self-funded items of the School Funds.

Article6:These Regulations shall be announced and take effect after being approved by the R&D Office and the School Funds Management Committee. The same procedure shall apply to revisions.
