

National Chengchi University Rules Governing the Encouragement of Undergraduate Students to Apply for Ministry of Science and Technology Research Projects

Article 1: National Chengchi University (hereinafter referred to as "the University") has formulated these rules with the aim of encouraging undergraduate students to engage in research projects and improve research methods and skills related to carrying out experiments and real-world tasks.

Article 2: Sophomore, junior, and senior students at the University who have obtained the research guidance agreement from a University professor and intend to apply for Ministry of Science and Technology's (hereinafter referred to as "MOST") "Engagement of University and College Students in Research Projects" shall receive scholarships after receiving the affiliated school's approval of research proposals, participating in related project symposiums and publication ceremonies, and complete the MOST application procedure. Approved scholarships are limited to NT\$5,000 per application; applications approved for MOST's subsidy may receive an additional scholarship to the maximum amount of NT\$5,000. The University shall award such scholarships to no more than 200 applications per year. The allocated quota for each school is calculated based on the University's performance indicators of the previous year, including number of students, applications of students participating in MOST research projects, and approval rate of such applications.

Article 3: Full-time faculty members at the University who meet the qualifications of MOST's criteria stipulated in the "Subsidy Guidelines for the Engagement of University and College Students in Research Projects" and who advise students of the University to implement MOST's research project shall receive a project advisor fee of NT\$4,000 per case.

Article 4: All necessary funding shall be prepared by the Five Self-Help Fundraisers of NCCU's school development fund.

Article 5: These rules shall be effective upon approval by the Research and Development meeting and school fund management board. The same applies for revisions.
